A Preface

The Babe Ke College of Education was started with a mission "To Produce High Spirited Teachers Imbued with Missionary Zeal" in Village Mudki of Distt. Ferozepur in the state of Punjab in 2006. The village Mudki has it's historical significance where the last Sikh battle was fought between Maharaja Ranjit Singh and Britishers in December 1845. It is very much known for having it's existence near the Holy Land of renowned Sufi Saint Baba Farid, the man of high spirit who spread the fragrance of universal brotherhood and communal harmony.

The college started it's journey in the field of Teacher Education from the session 2006-07 with an intake of one unit (100 seats) in B.Ed. course. 

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

B.Ed. COURSE:-

- Admission to B.Ed. will be held on the basis of State Level Common Entrance Test and Centralized Online Counseling by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar.
- ii) Students admitted under SC/ST category will have to submit their original SC/ST Certificate at the time of their admission else their admission will stand cancelled.
- iii) Candidates from universities other than Panjab University, Chandigarh will have to submit Migration Certificate in original and original detailed marks card of last class passed with in 30 days from the date of enrolment failing which they will have to pay Rs.1000/- as late fee to Panjab University, Chandigarh as per the rules and instructions of Panjab University, Chandigarh.

M.Ed. COURSE:-

Admission to M.Ed. will be held on the basis of Merit & the counseling conducted by the Federation of Self financed Colleges of Education, Punjab. Rest conditions are same as for B.Ed.

CERTIFICATES TO BE ATTACHED

Every student seeking admission to the B.Ed. Course shall be required to attach the following documents with the application form and No document will be entertained after the submission of the form. Attested copies of Certificates should be attached with admission form and original certificates will have to be produced at the time of interview.

- 1. Certificate of good character from the Principal of the institute in which the candidate studied last from the Head of the institute in which he/she studied last.
- An attested copy of Date of Birth certificate.



- Domicile Certificate.
- 4. Attested copy of degree (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./M.A./M.Sc/M.Com. and any other) along with detail marks certificate.
- 5. Printout of Allotment letter.
- 6. Certificate for special claim. Candidates seeking admission on the basis of special claim such as being daughter of army personnel, teacher's daughter, distinction in sports at the university, deserted, divorced, rural area claim etc. shall produce a certificate from the competent authority as specified in the application form supporting the claim. Provisional admission is not permissible. Incomplete form will be rejected without any obligation whatsoever.
- 7. Photo Copy of Aadhar Card
- Bank Account No.

FEE AND OTHER CHARGES

Fee will be charged as fixed by Federation of Self Financed Colleges of Education (Regd.), Punjab.

- Non Payment of fee with in 15 days will render a student liable to have his/her name struck off from the roll of the college.
- 2) If any student does not attend the college within a week of the opening day as announced by the college, his/her admission will stand cancelled.
- 3) All dues must be cleared before final examination.
- 4) Fee/Fines and other charges once paid shall not be refunded for any reason.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS IDENTITY CARD

All the students on the roll of the college are issued Identity Card on joining the college. On the presentation of Identity Card, the student will be issued library membership card. Students must keep the identity cards with them. These must be provided when demanded or checked by an official of the college. The identity card is non transferable. If a student loses his/her identity/library card, he/she can be issued a duplicate one on a payment of Rs. 100/-

UNIFORM

Immediately after joining the college, the students (B.Ed.) should get the following uniform prepared:

FOR GIRLS:- White Salwar, White Shirt, Ferozi Dupatta, Ferozi Sweater & Navy Blue Blazer (for winter) and White sports shoes.

FOR BOYS:- White Shirt, White Trousers, Ferozi Turban, Ferozi Sweater & Navy Blue Blazer (For Winter) and White sport shoes. The Uniform is to be worn on every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, Friday & also on all



function days of college. Students must avoid the use of cosmetics and should not wear gaudy/mod dresses.

SAMPLE FOR FEROZI COLOUR

The M.Ed. Students should get the following Uniform Prepared:

FOR GIRLS: White Salwar, White Shirt, A White Dupatta with stripes of Ferozi Colour, Ferozi Sweater & Navy Blue Blazer (for winter) & White Sport Shoes.

FOR BOYS: White Shirt, White Trousers, Ferozi Turban, Ferozi Sweater & Navy Blue Blazer (for winter) & White Sport Shoes. The Uniform is to be worn on every Monday & also on all function days of college.

FOR E.T.T. STUDENTS:

FOR GIRLS: White Salwar, White Shirt, Maroon Dupatta, Maroon Sweater & Maroon Blazer (for winter) & White Sport Shoes.

FOR BOYS: White Shirt, White Trousers, Maroon Turbon, Maroon Sweater & Maroon Blazer (for winter) & White Sport Shoes. The Uniform is to be worn on every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, Friday & also on all function days of college.

LEAVE RULES

- Leave must be sanctioned personally.
- 2. Application for leave must be signed by the parents of the guardians of the applicant. In case of illness the application should be accompanied by a medical certificate.
- 3. Student absent from the college without permission will be fined Rs. 20 per day. Absence from the group activities, seminars, work experience, activities and other practical will entail a fine of Rs. 20.
- 4. No leave will be granted when special functions are held in the college, in case of emergency leave may be granted by the Principal.
- 5. Leave will be sanctioned by the principal on the recommendation of the tutor of the students and must be got sanctioned before it is availed of.
- Leave for a particular Lecture may be granted by the Lecturer concerned.
- 7. The maximum leave allowed to a student during the session will be 15 days only.
- 8. When applying for leave, students must have his/her identity card with him/her.

NOTE:- The name of the student remaining absent from the institution for a period of two weeks without getting the leave sanctioned shall be automatically struck off from the rolls of the institution. His/her admission will be restored with the permission of the Principal on the payment of re-admission fee.

LIBRARY

The College has well equipped library with a wide variety of books and journals, e-books, e-journals on education and other topics.



LIBRARY RULES

- i) Two books will be issued for a period of 14 days only.
- ii) The books will be reissued if they are not in demand by the other students.
- iii) A fine of Rs. 5 per day per volume will be charged for a book returned after the due date.
- iv) Reference books, Text books, Rare books, periodicals shall not be issued except for consultation in the library premises.
- v) The students are required to possess their identity cards while inside the library and reading room. The defaulters will be asked to leave and their case will be reported to the Principal.
- vi) Books issued from the library should be kept very carefully and in no case be underlined and disfigured. If the book is already damaged in any form, it should be got checked by the librarian otherwise the responsibility will be of student himself/herself.
- vii) Students should check whether all pages are intact or not before getting the books issued. If pages are found missing at the time of returning them they will be fined heavily. Inform the librarian along with the notification of missing pages.
- viii) The loss of books should be reported to the librarian before the due date, in the absence of which fine will be charged till the information given. The borrower will be required to replace it. She/He will have to pay double the price if the book could not be replaced.
- ix) The students are expected to observe perfect silence in the reading room and not to disturb others in any way.
- x) The students are expected to keep their belongings outside the library.
- xi) Students should make an entry in the register, before entering and leaving the library.
- xii) Students are expected to switch off the fans before going out of the library.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Wearing of college uniform is compulsory during college hours and at the college functions.
- The institution enforces simplicity in dress. The wearing of all kinds of gold and diamond ornaments is also discouraged.
- All the students must be punctual. Students, who are coming from far off places should either avail
 college bus facility or make their own arrangement for reaching college in time. No excuse will be
 entertained for their coming late in the college.
- 4. Students will not be allowed to miss the classes while in campus. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against the defaulters.
- 5. Students are advised to see the notice board daily. No excuse will be entertained if a student fails to read any important notice. The consequence of this neglect will rest upon the students.



- 6. Students are not allowed to remove any notice from the notice board which has been put up by the college. Such student if identified will be fined or liable to disciplinary action.
- 7. Leave must be got sanctioned from the college authorities in advance up to 2 days from the Tutor and more than 2 days from the Principal. Medical leave must be granted by the Principal. The leave application should be supported by a valid medical certificate and recommended by your Tutor.
- 8. Guardians and parents will please note that visitors are not allowed to see the students during college hours.
- 9. Any student who misbehaves or creates nuisance in the college will be fined heavily by the Principal.
- 10. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against the student who is found using mobile phone in the college campus.
- 11. Students are advised to actively participate in all activities of the college so that their teachers can help them in identifying their talent.
- 12. Students shall maintain discipline and necessary decorum in and outside the classroom.
- 13. Students are expected to be courteous and polite in their dealing with one another and the employers of the college.
- 14. Proper respect should be shown to the teachers and their instructions should be carried out strictly.
- 15. Movement from one class to another should be orderly. At the end of a period the incoming students should wait outside till the classroom has been completely vacated.
- 16. Perfect silence should be maintained in the classes, in the reading room and in the varandhas so that none is disturbed in studies and the atmosphere prevailing in the college remains congenial for academic pursuit.
- 17. The students should inculcate the queue habit while they go to see the Principal or pay dues in the accounts office or get books issued from the library.
- 18. The students must not loiter about in the varandhas unnecessarily.
- 19. At any time during the course of training the principal may at his discretion remove the name of a student from the college rolls if he/she has failed to make progress in studies or has been found guilty of misconduct.
- 20. The students should understand that the college property is an asset of the nation as such its maintenance is as much their duty as that of administration. Therefore, do not and let not any one damage the furniture or the wall with pen or pencil or chalk marks.

RAGGING IS STRICTLY BANNED

Any student found committing or abetting or indulging in ragging shall be punished/ rusticated/ expelled/ suspended from the College. Ragging Includes disorderly conduct whether by words, spoken or written or by an



act which has the affect of teasing and handling any other student with rudeness, Indulging in rowdy or In disciplined activities which cause or is likely to cause hardship or psychological harm or raise fear or apprehension in a fresher or in a junior student.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PROSPECTIVE TEACHERS

EVERY PROSPECTIVE TEACHERS SHOULD:

- Make it a habit to see the college notice board everyday.
- Be regular and punctual to class.
- Practice and promote integrity, sincerity and self discipline at all times.
- 4. Be brief in talk whether on phone or in person.
- 5. Use his/her time fruitfully and in a planned way to complete the various tasks & go to college library during free period.
- 6. Promote the concept of 'Dignity of Labour' and help in keeping the college premises neat and clean.
- 7. Use college property with care and park vehicles at the proper place only.

ATTENDANCE AND HOUSE EXAMINATION

- 1. At least 75% attendance is essential for a student to appear in the annual examination and the student having more than 75% will be given weightage.
- 2. House Tests are held twice a year. Both tests are compulsory for the students as the internal assessment will be made on the basis of performance of house tests, class tests and assignment in each paper.
- Fortnightly tests in all the subjects are mandatory for all the students.
- 4. Exemption from any house examination, or fortnightly test will not be given except under any exceptional circumstances.
- 5. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students who absent themselves from the house examination or fortnightly test. Absence from house examination or fortnightly test will also liable a student to heavy fine.
- 6. Students will have to secure at least 40% marks in each examination and in each paper or else, they will not be allowed to appear in final exams. Any student, who fails to appear in any of the examination paper for whatever reasons will not be entitled to annual academic prize.
- 7. No mercy test will be conducted in the college. Hence the internal assessment of the student who fail to appear in examination will not be sent.

PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

MORNING ASSEMBLY:-

The college starts with morning assembly everyday where students and teachers get an opportunity to give brief



talks on education, religion and morality. An open discussion on the discussed topic is also held. Presence of all staff members and students is compulsory.

TRAINING IN SPOKEN ENGLISH:-

The Institute has special provision for the students who cannot express them self in English. The College Teachers under the guidance of an expert of this field guide the students for fluency in English language.

TUTORIAL GROUPS:-

To provide intimate personal contact with teachers, each student is assigned a tutor who guides him/her through out his/her stay in the college. It helps in closer supervision of the work and progress of the students by lecturer-in-charge. Activities in the tutorials include academic discussion, identification of latent talents of students and giving individual attention to problems, if any, faced by students in any subject. All the Tutors maintain a record of the activities under taken by each student. Presence of students in these meetings is compulsory.

HOUSE SYSTEM:-

The motive of having 'House' is to give opportunities to students for self expression, inculcate leadership qualities, to help students to shoulder responsibilities and help them to understand the concept of co-operation and team-spirit. The students from all sections are divided in to six houses:

- 1. Gandhi House
- 2. Aurobindo House
- 3. Nehru House
- 4. Tagore House
- 5. Radha Krishanan House
- Vivekanand House

Each house functions under the charge of two lecturers and remains on duty for one week. The main duties of each house are:

- To conduct daily morning assembly.
- (ii) To check cleanliness of the campus and to maintain discipline in the campus.
- (iii) To check late comers, who are without uniform and wrong parking of vehicles.
- (iv) To actively participate in the inter house competitions organised by different clubs in the institution.

CLUBS:-

In order to enable students to cope up with the outside world for the benefit of society and to give practical training in organization of various co-curricular activities, we have the provision of the following clubs in our institution:

Each Club functions under the supervision of two Lecturers. Each club organizes at least one Inter House Competition during the session. The main functions of these clubs are:

(1) ECO CLUB:-

Eco Club aims at creating environment awareness among the would be teachers and inmates of rural and urban slums of Mudki and the surrounding area by organizing seminars, poster making and slogan writing competitions etc.

(2) SOCIAL WELFARE CLUB:-

Social Welfare Club aims at bringing awareness and helping people with in the local community to identity social needs and to find the most effective ways to meet these needs. The main functions of this club include working for old age homes, Bal Niketans, Organizing Blood Donation Camps etc.

(3) PRESS CLUB :-

The aim of the press club is to enable the students to acquire the skills for preparing press releases, managing the wall magazine and the college magazine for the academic session.

(4) HEALTH AND NUTRITION CLUB:-

The Health and Nutrition Club aims at making students and general public aware regarding maintenance of good health, healthy food habits, nutrition values of food items and their requirement for different age groups.



DURATION

The elementary teacher education programme is of duration of two academic years

WORKING DAYS

There are at least two hundred working days each year exclusive of the period of examination and admission, out of which at least forty days shall be for practice teaching skill development in nearby primary schools.

ELIGIBILITY:

- a) Candidates with at least 50% marks in the senior secondary (+2) or its equivalent examination are eligible for admission.
- b) The reservation for SC/ST/OBC and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government/State Government, whichever is applicable. There shall be relaxation of 5% marks in favour of SC/ST/OBC and other categories of candidates.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:-

Admission will be made on merit on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination and or in the entrance examination or any other selection process as per the policy of the state Government/UT/SCERT


